# Just The Beginning Foundation and University of Minnesota Law School

#### **OVERVIEW**

Just The Beginning Foundation ("JTBF") is a nonprofit service organization dedicated to improving the legal system in the United States and preserving and honoring the legacy of minorities in the federal judiciary. The organization seeks to develop and nurture an interest in the legal profession among young people from underrepresented groups and to support their continued advancement, with the long-term goal of increasing diversity in the federal courts and the legal profession as a whole.

The JTBF Summer Legal Institute is an exciting seven-day program designed to introduce high school students to the legal system, expose them to careers in the law, and provide them with practical tools for achieving their educational goals. Students work with judges, lawyers and law students on legal reasoning, case analysis, writing, negotiation and oral argument exercises. In addition, students and their parents/guardians/mentors receive college preparatory advice on topics such as preparing for standardized tests, completing applications and securing financial aid.

### JTBF Twin Cities Summer Legal Institute 2009

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Summer Legal Institute ("the SLI") is scheduled to run from approximately 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each weekday (July 9 — July 17, 2009), with a dinner session for students and their parents/guardians/mentors on the final day. The SLI involves a combination of classroom lectures, logic and critical thinking exercises, writing and oral advocacy instruction, guest speakers, and field trips to area law firms, corporations, government offices and courthouses

Students who participate in the SLI will:

- Study the legal system and how it works;
- Analyze selected cases, debate legal issues and participate in a mock oral argument;
- Learn what it takes to become a lawyer;
- Develop contacts with legal professionals and organizations that provide scholarships, internships and mentors;
- Gain insight into the college admissions process, from preparing for standardized tests to writing persuasive essays; and
- Find out about financial aid resources for college and law school.

Recognizing that the involvement of adult role models is critical to a student's educational success, the SLI includes a Friday dinner on the last day where parents/guardians/mentors learn the steps involved in helping students navigate the process of taking standardized tests, applying to college, exploring financial aid and working toward the ultimate goal of attending law school.

#### LOCATION

The SLI will be held on the campus of the University of Minnesota Law School, located at Walter F. Mondale Hall, 229 19th Ave. South in downtown Minneapolis.

#### **COST**

The SLI is free to the students. JTBF will provide breakfast and lunch each day of the program. Students are responsible for their transportation expenses to and from the first day of the program. Students will receive free Metro Transit passes to cover their transportation for the remaining days of the program.

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

The SLI is open to students who will be high school sophomores, juniors or seniors in the fall of 2009. Enrollment is limited to forty students. To apply, students must submit the following:
